

ENVIRONMENTAL ALLERGIES IN PETS

Common Triggers

Seasonal vs. Year-Round

Paying attention to whether your pet's symptoms worsen during certain months or stay consistent throughout the year can help identify the source.

Symptoms

Pets with environmental allergies often show symptoms such as persistent itching, red or inflamed skin, excessive licking or chewing of paws, watery eyes, sneezing, and recurrent ear infections. Environmental allergies typically present as skin or respiratory issues. Repeated scratching can even lead to hair loss or secondary skin infections if left untreated.

Diagnosis

Because symptoms can mimic other conditions, a veterinarian's evaluation is essential. Allergy testing such as intradermal skin or blood tests can help identify specific environmental triggers and rule out other causes.

Treatment Options

Managing environmental allergies is a multi-faceted approach. Wiping your pet's paws and coat after outdoor walks can remove surface allergens. Using air filters and maintaining a clean home reduces indoor triggers like dust mites. Medications such as antihistamines, corticosteroids, or topical treatments can alleviate symptoms. In some cases, immunotherapy (allergy shots or oral drops) is prescribed, gradually desensitizing your pet to the allergens over time.
